RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute an agreement with Gaumard Scientific for training, installation, and preventative maintenance services to the neonatal simulators at NMC for an amount not to exceed \$11,095 with an agreement term July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2026.
- b. Approve the NMC's Chief Executive Officer's recommendation to accept non-standard indemnification provisions within the agreement.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Our primary goal at Natividad Medical Center is to provide high quality and safe patient care. One of the ways we achieve this at Natividad Medical Center is to promote ongoing professional staff development through various teaching modalities such as continuing education and simulation-based learning activities. The Natividad Simulation Lab has upgraded to an untethered neonatal simulator manikin, manufactured by Gaumard Scientific, and a service agreement is needed to ensure regular preventive maintenance for this high-fidelity neonatal simulator manikin. The goal of preventive maintenance service is to prevent equipment failure before it occurs and ensure safe equipment use throughout the product's life span. Gaumard Scientific will provide annual periodic maintenance service to make sure that the simulator manikin remains calibrated to warranty standard levels. Each preventive maintenance service includes extensive assessment, testing, software updates, and replacement of components as needed to ensure the manikin maintains peak performance levels. This service is valuable to provide for a very realistic full-body patient presentation during simulation learning activities, which is specifically helpful for healthcare professionals to practice and master a specific task or skill in a safe learning environment.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on June 14, 2024.

FINANCING:

The cost for this agreement is \$11,095 which is included in the FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad has been working with Raimi and Associates since November 2022 on the development of its three-year strategic plan. The Monterey County Health Department recommended Raimi and Associates to the hospital, as they had utilized this firm in the past and were planning to start their strategic planning process with them as well. There have been multiple stakeholder meetings both in person and virtually, utilizing a variety of facilitation techniques, including small and large group discussions, and other approaches that consider literacy, culture, and diverse learning and communication styles. The discussions have been robust to date, and Natividad desires to increase the number of in person stakeholder meetings and extend the term of the contract to October 31, 2025. Raimi and Associates will be instrumental in developing a dashboard for Natividad to monitor its progress on its strategic plan. Natividad anticipates a draft of the strategic plan with an accompanying dashboard to be completed by end of year 2025.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center (NMC) completed a classification and base wage compensation study of the Hospital Medical Interpreter classification series that is responsible a variety of interpreting, translating, and escorting activities at NMC. Subsequently, a classification study was requested to determine if there was enough market data available to support the creation of a lead-level classification with a unique salary range aligned with available market data.

The classification study found that sufficient market data was available to support the creation of a lead level classification. To establish the salary for the new classification, NMC completed a base wage compensation study and found that the job duties and responsibilities of the Hospital Senior Medical Interpreter position was matched to two (2) of the six (6) hospital comparable agencies: Alameda Highland Hospital and San Mateo Medical Center. After a thorough review and analysis of available data, no comparable matches were identified at Contra Costa Regional Medical Center, Salinas Valley Health, Santa Clara Valley Medical Center and Hazel Hawkins Hospital. In accordance with the Compensation Philosophy, internal comparisons were reviewed to set base wages in the absence of sufficient external data at the top monthly step of approximately \$7,602.

NMC is seeking consideration from the Board of Supervisors to adopt a Resolution to create the new classification of Hospital Senior Medical Interpreter with the respective salary and reallocate two (2) filled Hospital Medical Interpreter positions to two (2) Hospital Senior Medical Interpreter positions.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Monterey County Human Resources Department, and Monterey County Office of County Counsel have reviewed this recommendation. In addition, the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) Local 521 has been provided notice of these recommendations.

FINANCING:

The salary and benefits increased costs for the current positions (2.0 FTE filled) budgeted for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2024-25 is approximately \$22,881 and then \$23,796 annually thereafter. The funding for personnel costs is provided by NMC's enterprise fund comprised of patient services revenues received from commercial insurance, state, and federal government agencies. This action does not impact the General Fund.

NMC would like to amend its agreement with Monterey County Eye Associates, a medical group with board certified fellowship trained ophthalmologist, who provide 24 hours a day, 7 days a week ophthalmology call coverage in the emergency department. NMC has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this amendment as to fiscal provisions. The amendment has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

FINANCING:

The cost of this amendment is \$289,132. The total not to exceed amount of this agreement is \$1625406 for the period June 1, 2019 to June 30, 2025. \$289,132 is included in the Fiscal Year 2024/2025 Adopted Budget. There is no impact to the General Fund.




