Authorize the CEO for NMC or his designee to sign up to three (3) amendments to these agreements where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work, do not exceed 10% (\$80,000) of the original contract amount and do not increase the total contract amount above \$880,000.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute the Professional Services Agreement with Sheryl Laurissa Recinos dba Recinos Family Medicine, a California professional corporation to provide hospitalist services for an amount not to exceed \$800,000 for the period October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2026; and b. Authorize the CEO for NMC or his designee to sign up to three (3) amendments to these agreements where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work, do not exceed 10% (\$80,000) of the original contract amount and do not increase the total contract amount above \$880,000.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

NMC operates medical surgical units and an acute rehabilitation unit that provide direct patient care to hospitalized patients 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. In order to ensure sufficient staffing of these critical units with at least four physicians during the day and one physician at night who are immediately available to provide patient care, it requires a team of employee and independent contractor physicians, known as hospitalists. NMC wishes to enter into an agreement with Sheryl Laurissa Recinos dba Recinos Family Medicine, a California professional corporation, for a which Dr. Recinos, a board-certified family medicine physician, provides hospitalist services. NMC has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to fiscal provisions. The Amendment has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

FINANCING:

The total not to exceed amount of the Agreement is \$800,000 for the period October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2026. \$300,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2024/2025 Adopted Budget. The remining amount will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. Funding will be provided from NMC's Enterprise Fund 451-9600-6608.

The services rendered in this agreement provide NMC with the additional support it needs to

delivery reliable and high-quality patient care which improves the health and quality of life for patients and their families.

RECOMMENDATION:

NMC operates medical surgical units and an acute rehabilitation unit that provide direct patient care to hospitalized patients 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. In order to ensure sufficient staffing of these critical units with at least four physicians during the day and one physician at night who are immediately available to provide patient care, it requires a team of employee and independent contractor physicians, known as hospitalists. NMC wishes to amend its agreement with Natalie La Corte Medical Corporation, for a which Dr. Natalie La Corte, a board-certified family medicine physician, provides the hospitalist services. NMC has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms.

NMC has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

A base wage compensation study of the Hospital Controller classification was requested by Natividad Medical Center (NMC) administrative staff. The reasons cited for the request were to check for salary alignment with the hospital comparable agencies identified in the County's Compensation Philosophy last updated in January 2023.

The base wage analysis of the County's hospital comparable agencies found that based on the duties performed, the Hospital Controller classification was matched to four (4) of the six (6) hospital comparable agencies: Alameda Health System, Salinas Valley Health, San Mateo Medical Center and Santa Clara Valley Medical Center. After thorough analysis of the data available at the time of the study, it was determined that no comparable match was made at Contra Costa Regional Medical Center or Hazel Hawkins. The Hospital Controller classification is approximately 11.16% below the salary mean of the comparable agency's classifications.

To promote the County as the employer of choice, the goal is to provide labor market competitive wages by setting base wages within five percent (5% = -4.495% with rounding) of the average of the agencies identified. The County's philosophy is to maintain a competitive compensation package that attracts and retains the highest quality candidates and employees to serve the community while maintaining sound fiscal standards.

Therefore, in accordance with the County's Compensation Philosophy, the base wage salary of the Hospital Controller classification would need to be adjusted by approximately 11.16% at top step in order to align with the labor market average.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Human Resources Department concurs with the recommendations. County Employee Management Association (CEMA) has been notified of the recommendations.

FINANCING:

The salary and benefits increased costs for the current position (1.0 FTE filled) budgeted for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2024-25 is approximately \$18,753 and then \$24,379 annually thereafter. The funding for personnel costs is provided by NMC's enterprise fund comprised of patient services revenues received from commercial insurance, state, and federal government agencies. Funding will be provided from NMC's Enterprise Fund 451-9600-6111.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center (NMC) completed a classification and base wage compensation study of the Supervising Certified Phlebotomy Technician position and recommend the creation of this new classification with a base wage salary aligned with internal classifications.

The Laboratory Department has been providing supervision of non-licensed laboratory staff through the classifications of Clinical Laboratory Manager and Supervising Clinical Laboratory Scientists. The responsibility of providing supervision of the non-licensed laboratory staff has grown and it was determined that it can be more effectively managed at a lower level than the manager of the department without taking away from the licensed staff within the department.

To establish the salary range for the new classification, NMC completed a base wage compensation study and found that the job duties, responsibilities and certifications of a Supervising Certified Phlebotomy Technician position were not matched to any of the six (6) hospital comparable agencies: Alameda Highland Hospital, Contra Costa Regional Medical Center, Hazel Hawkins Hospital, Salinas Valley Health, San Mateo Medical Center, or Santa Clara Medical Center.

The County Compensation Philosophy requires a minimum of three (3) benchmark classification matches with our comparable agencies in order to provide sufficient data for analyzing and determining a base wage comparison. The County reserves the right to consider internal comparisons when in the best interest of the County. As a result, NMC recommends the creation of the new classification of Supervising Certified Phlebotomy Technician with a top monthly salary of approximately \$7,208 set at 5% above Senior Certified Phlebotomy Technician.

NMC is seeking consideration from the Board of Supervisors to adopt a Resolution to create the new classification of Supervising Certified Phlebotomy Technician with the respective salary.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Monterey County Office of County Counsel has reviewed this recommendation. In addition, the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) has been provided notice of these recommendations.

FINANCING:

There is no cost increase for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2024-25. The funding for personnel costs is provided by Natividad Medical Center's enterprise fund comprised of patient services revenues received from commercial insurance, state, and federal government agencies. This action does not impact the General Fund.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

In April 2015, Natividad Medical Center (NMC) conducted a Request for Proposals (RFP) to provide referral of locum tenens physicians. Locum tenens are physicians who temporarily take the place of physicians during periods when physicians (employed or contracted) are not available (e.g., vacation; illness; continuing medical education; etc.) to provide health care services vital to NMC's continued operation.

In order to find highly qualified temporary physicians and other locum tenens, such as advanced practitioners, who match the position we are trying to cover and are available on sometimes very short notice, it is necessary to contract with multiple locum tenens agencies. Due to multiple factors, including physician shortages in certain hard to fill specialties, NMC is experiencing a high utilization of locum tenens physicians and wishes to amend the agreements to extend the term and add funds ensuring temporary physicians are available when needed to provide the patient care services critical to NMC's operation without interruption.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this renewal and amendment No.12 and renewal and amendment No. 13 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. This service complies with Federal and State privacy laws.

Traverse Exchange facilitates better coordination of care. This can lead to improved patient outcomes, a reduction in medical errors, and enhanced patient satisfaction. Traverse Exchange streamlines workflows for healthcare providers by allowing them to access relevant patient data with fewer obstacles. This reduces the time spent searching for information and increases the efficiency of healthcare delivery. With improved interoperability, healthcare providers have access to more comprehensive and up-to-date patient information. This can lead to more accurate diagnoses, treatment decisions, and care plans.

Traverse is replacing CommonWell as Meditech's health information exchange platform by the end of this calendar year. As with CommonWell, Natividad Medical Center plans to leverage the Traverse Exchange network to access the health information of patients under its care across the care continuum. There is no cost to subscribe to and use the Traverse Exchange service as it is included in the hospital's existing MEDITECH annual support and maintenance agreement.
